

### ADVANCED SEARCH


In this tutorial we will show you how to use Advanced Search to look for keywords in specific titles from the Irwin Books collection.

#### Click on Advanced Search




COMMENTARY: Advanced Search allows you to combine keywords with search operators and filters to quickly narrow your search results.

# Filter by Jurisdiction



COMMENTARY: By default, the jurisdiction will be set to Canada. However, you also have the option to select a specific province if needed.

### Filter by Content Type



COMMENTARY: For this example, we are only interested in searching for content from the Irwin Books collection. For that reason, we chose Books and Journals as a filter.

### Combine Keywords with Search Operators






COMMENTARY: We added quotation marks to malicious prosecution because we want to search for it as a complete phrase and not as separate words. You can hover your cursor over the question mark symbol to bring up a list of other search operators to use. ## Add More Filters (e.g. Publisher and Source)




COMMENTARY: In the example above, we added Irwin Law Inc. as a Publisher filter. We also added The Law of Torts. Sixth Edition as a Source filter. This will allow us to limit our search results to the Irwin Books collection, and The Law of Torts specifically. You can disregard the Source filter if your goal is to search the entire Irwin Books collection instead of a specific book.

### Click on Show Matching Paragraphs



COMMENTARY: Show Matching Paragraphs will allow you to quickly find where you keywords are.
